TEAM FINALIZATION

To formalize your group, you will need to create a project on devpost.com under the T9Hacks' hackathon and include all your team members. If you are unfamiliar with devpost, follow these steps:

1. You and your team must create accounts on devpost.com.
2. Go to the [T9Hacks Hackathon](https://t9hacks.com/hackathon). "Register" for the hackathon.
3. One person in your team should [create a project](#). Fill out all the information about your project. Then, when prompted, click "Submit to a hackathon". Find T9Hacks.
4. After you have successfully submitted your project, click "[+ add team members](#)" to add all members of your group to your project.

INVISION

"Get high-fidelity in under 5 minutes. Upload your design files and add animations, gestures, and transitions to transform your static screens into clickable, interactive prototypes." InVision is a prototyping tool for websites and mobile apps.

InVision has given T9Hackers a free 3-month trial of their software. Their software lets you quickly create mock-ups, get feedback, and share your work with a team.
